

Kent County Solar Energy Proposals

The Solar Energy Review Committee heard formal presentations from three interested vendor teams on Thursday, July 14, 2011 at the offices of Funk & Bolton in Chestertown. The Review Committee members consist of Jim Wright, County Engineer; John Johnson, KCPS Supervisor of Environmental Services; Wayne Morris, Director of the Kent County Department of Public Works; Briggs Cunningham, resident and Kent County Renewable Energy Task Force member, and Chip MacLeod, KCPS General Counsel. All members reviewed the submittals and were present for the presentations, with the exception of Mr. Morris due to an injury. All three vendors and their solar contractor partners were considered reputable in the renewable energy industry with experience in the field. All three vendors are capable and generally qualified to partner with Kent County.

The three vendor/teams that submitted proposals for consideration were:

- 1. Greenlight Power Company, Inc., Vienna, VA (with SEMPNO 1, LLC, Bethesda, MD)
- 2. Kenyon Energy, LLC, Jacksonville, FL (with Aztec Solar Power, LLC, Wayne, PA)
- Washington Gas Energy Services, Herndon, VA (with Standard Solar, Inc., Rockville, MD)

After reviewing vendor submittals and hearing the presentations, the Review Committee discussed the three proposals in detail and it was the decision of the Committee that Washington Gas Energy Services, with Standard Solar, Inc., was the best candidate for partnering with Kent County in this endeavor. Washington Gas has completed the largest number of solar projects in and around Maryland in comparison to

the other vendors. Their clients include The Catholic University of America, The Bullis School, Perdue Farms, University of Maryland, Anne Arundel Community College and American University. The selection of a utility company backed vendor¹ adds financial security to the project since the all-important energy credits are retained by the utility and do not require disposition in a volatile market. Washington Gas also provided the most attractive Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) electric rate of the three vendors, which translates in the greatest savings in terms of the electricity costs. It was also clearly demonstrated that Washington Gas, in partnership with Standard Solar, conducted extensive research into both Kent County and KCPS facilities, energy usage patterns and the existing electrical infrastructure leading to and throughout the Worton Campus. In addition, Standard Solar is represented by Mr. Robert H. Busler, AIA, Director of Channel Sales, who happens to be a resident of Chestertown.

The Review Committee requests your approval to move forward with the formal selection of Washington Gas Energy Services (teamed with Standard Solar, Inc.) as the solar energy vendor of choice for Kent County and Kent County Public Schools. It is believed that having a common vendor for both Kent County and KCPS will maximize opportunities and efficiencies as alternative energy options are jointed explored.

The Washington Gas/Standard Solar team is available to make a formal presentation to the County Commissioners and Board of Education. Subject to scheduling considerations, the Review Committee recommends a joint presentation on Monday, August 1, during the Board of Education's regularly monthly meeting, or during an upcoming meeting of the County Commissioners, or during a special meeting of both Boards devoted to this project. Such a concerted approach at this stage will go a long way in keeping all decision makers and staff on the same page.

Please let us know your preference and we will move forward accordingly. Thank you for your attention and consideration.

As a related matter, under separate cover you will be receiving a recommended letter to the Maryland Public Service Commission in support of pending State regulations regarding "meter aggregation" and "virtual net metering" for municipal utility customers (PSC Administrative Docket RM41). If the pending regulations are adopted, local government entities (counties, towns, boards of education) will realize more efficient, more financially feasible and more streamlined alternative energy opportunities.

PURPOSE

The Administration is submitting for Board review and approval Budget Adjustment #6 for both the Unrestricted and Restricted Funds. This budget adjustment seeks to reallocate funds across categories within the Approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2010-2011 Budget, and also increases the Restricted Budget in accordance with The Maryland Annotated Code, Education Articles ED-105.

SUMMARY

1) Unrestricted Funds

Since the approval of Budget Adjustment #5 one additional increase of \$1,000 was received from MSDE. This was to be paid as a stipend to a teacher with National Board Certification.

Line item adjustments have been made within categories as of year end to ensure that no sub-object within a category was in a deficit position.

One across category change was made to transfer funds from maintenance to capital outlay to support the cost of the signage at the administrative office.

2) Restricted Funds

Since the approval of Budget adjustment #5 the school system has received several additional grants through MSDE and one increase from the LMB. These changes are detailed as follows:
