

Our venue, the Betterton Community Center, is at Main Street and First Avenue, and was formerly the Most Precious Blood Catholic Church. According to Peter Heck, local writer and journalist, the Rev. 



A Chesapeake Campaign event, held over Labor Day weekend on August 30 and August 31 of 2014, it will focus on events that occurred during the Battle of Caulk's Field, in which Americans fought against the British, resulting in an American victory and the death of the British Commander Sir Peter Parker and 14 of his men. The Semiannual property tax law, as contained in Section 10-204.3 of the Maryland Tax-Property Article, requires each taxing authority to annually obtain approval from our Department for the amount of their service charge.

Further, the local taxing authority must provide to the Department of Assessments and Taxation by May 1 of each year, information that substantiates that the proposed service charge for the lost interest is reasonably equivalent to the interest that will be lost as a result of the semiannual payment. Maximum rate is 1.5%. Administrative expenses may not exceed the lesser of the actual expenses incurred in the preceding fiscal year or 10% of the lost interest charge. The maximum service charge is 1.65%.

To properly comply with this requirement and receive SDAT approval of your service charge, we are attaching a standard form which you should fax or mail to our office. Merely state the service charge you will be imposing and provide a brief explanation of how you arrived at that charge. In the explanation section, please state briefly your subdivision's earning rate on your investments for the prior fiscal quarter.

Kindly provide to us this information as soon as possible so we can quickly grant approval of your service charge. Approvals will be faxed back to the contact person you designate.
