

Kent County Population (MD Department of Labor, Licensing, and Labor via U.S. Census)


The graph below shows the annual Population data for Kent County, MD in Multiple Time Periods.




### **Kent County Population 2000-2017**




**Queen Anne's County Population 1970-2017 (49,770--2017 est.)**





Large counties now dominate where new business establishments are created.






- Participation in hunting dropped by 2 million people to 11.5 million hunters
- 2011-2016 total expenditures by hunters declined by 30%, from \$36 billion to \$25 billion

Common Arguments Against a Third Span

## Self-driving cars will make third span obsolete and unnecessary.

- Determining when self-driving cars will become mainstream is difficult.
- Self-driving cars have yet to face major resistance from cardependent industries like insurance agencies.
- Some analysts believe selfdriving cars could make traffic worse, not better.

### Chestertown and Kent County are thriving.

Whereas the Chestertown Marina is being revitalized, KRM developing Chestertown Business Campus, and businesses are are expanding...

- # of overall business
  establishment is down 17% since
  2005.
- Schools would need an influx of hundreds of kids to stabilize.
   Thousands to get back to preconsolidation levels.

### Third span should focus on mass transit.

- Kent County has transit services through DCT.
- Mass transit is just as capable as road construction to be a boondoggle, especially in lowdensity areas.
- Resistance from environmental groups can be surprisingly high (Maryland Purple Line).

#### At the end of the day...The numbers don't lie

- Third oldest county in Maryland by median age
- Declining population
- Declining public school enrollment
- Declining business establishments
- Despite 10-years of economic expansion
  - More poverty today tham 2010
  - Home values have not recovered
- Long-term national trends spell increased trouble for rural areas--Kent County is not immune

#### Early Stages of a Death Spiral?

 Young people leave (reflected in school enrollment), population declines and suppresses property values→ Many people, including elderly, rely on home equity for savings. Homes are underwater and they cant afford to sell.

- As population leaves, tax base drops. As tax base drops, infrastructure and services are cut back (schools). When services are reduced, businesses suffer and more people leave.
  - Wharton School of Business

Our rallying cry should be "Maximize the Upsides and Mitigate the Downsides of a Third Span."

### Tools in the Planning Toolbox

- Retail square foot cap in place.
- Adopt strict architectural standards.
- Selectively extend water and sewer to designated growth areas.
- Toll local access routes off highway.
- Remove parking minimums.
- Lower setback requirements.
