 Transportation service doesn't meet the needs/difficult to access. Upper Shore Regional Council to advertise, find new resources. Housing: connecting providers and clients, Samaritan Group and expanding emergency/transitional housing services

COVID 19: Samaritan Group has a comprehensive plan but no resolution for COVID 19 positive guests. Local opinions





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have refused. United Way has COVID emergency funding option for non-profits – underutilized.

Babies Born Healthy – Substance Exposed Newborns (needs FY19 and FY20 final numbers – Nikki Strong)

-OBGYN left Kent County in Oct. 2020 – important service gap currently

Families are Safe and Economically Stable

- -FARM eligible students 2019-2020 56.4% struggling to get families to return paperwork in Garnet and Rock Hall where meals are universal
- -Median Family Income 2012-2016, large racial disparities
- -Poverty Rate by Race large racial disparities
- -# youth under 20 enrolled in Medicaid by County and Town Upward trends in Chestertown, Betterton, Massey, & Millington, downward trend Galena, Rock Hall, and Worton.

Medicaid redeterminations are postponed until March 2021. Children Are Successful in School

Gail Yerkie, KCHD: testing 2 days/wk capped at 100 per day. Business compliance, education. Vaccination distribution plan.




Substance Exposed Newborns, Kent




KCDSS 2020 – need to update FY19 and FY20 numbers – these are estimates.


% FARM Eligible Students in KCPS



Medium Family Income




2016 Poverty Rate by Race




ACS 5 Year Estimates 2016 for # in poverty by race for numerator and population by age and race for denominator







Racial and Economic Disparities in KCPS Chronic Absenteeism


