On behalf of Governor Larry Hogan, thank you for contacting us regarding child care. After reviewing your correspondence, Governor Hogan asked the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) to respond to you on his behalf, as well as on behalf of our fellow state agencies. The MSDE understands this is a challenging time for both parents and child care providers.

On June 5, 2020, as the State enters Stage Two of the *Maryland Strong: The Road to Recovery*, the number of businesses allowed to reopen is expanding across the state, and parents who work in these businesses will now have access to child care. To help meet this increased demand, the Maryland State Department of Education will continue to expand our open child care sites, increasing the total number of available slots across the state.
