ACTION ITEMS

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Discussion of Senate Bill 762 and House Bill 1262:

The members discussed Senate Bill 762 and House Bill 1262 which, if passed, would relinquish electrical testing and licensing from the individual counties to the State. If passed, the new process could go into effect as early as July 1, 2021.

Chief Enforcement Officer Mike Bitting informed the Board that he reached out to the Queen Anne's County Electrical Board to determine how the Bill is being perceived in their county. He said they are also not in favor of the Bill passing and that they intend to submit an unfavorable letter to their County Commissioners.

Mr. Usilton and Mr. Baldwin agreed to draft a letter to the Kent County Commissioners documenting the reasons why they too are not in favor of the bill passing. <u>Action</u>: Chief Enforcement Officer Mike Bitting will supply the Board with the letter format.
