Dear Mr. Mackey and Kent County Comprehensive Rezoning Task Force,

<u>ShoreRivers</u>, along with nearly 500 area residents, recreationists, and students, submit this letter in support of the proposed citizen amendment to strengthen forest conservation protection in Kent County's Land Use Ordinances. ShoreRivers is a regional nonprofit with over 3,500 members. We are dedicated to the protection and restoration of the waterways of the Eastern Shore through science based advocacy, education, and restoration.

Beyond serving as carbon sinks, trees are essential to protecting and improving water quality. Trees decrease erosion and sediment from entering the waterways, remove excess nutrients, slow stormwater runoff, shade impervious surfaces, and reduce pollutants in our watershed. Protecting and restoring trees on the Eastern Shore and in our county is instrumental in the long-term preservation of the Chesapeake Bay.

Kent County's Comprehensive Plan acknowledges the "rich agricultural, natural, cultural, and human resources [that] provide the basis for the County's superior quality of life. Fertile soils, gentle topography, mild climate, **verdant woodlands**, the Chesapeake Bay with its productive tidal tributaries, wetlands, and marshes create an environment nearly unrivaled. These natural features enrich our economy and our lives." The plan goes on to outline a strategy for no net tree loss in Kent County (Kent Comp Plan, pg. 76). The proposed text amendment supports protection of forests without having a negative impact on development in the area. Other countries have increased their fee in lieu and there is no evidence that it deters development in the area. **The proposed citizen amendment aligns with the county's comprehensive plan to "embrace sufficient economic opportunities" (Kent Comp Plan, pg. 1) while working towards a net zero loss of trees and protection of the bay.**

Nearly 500 members of the Sassafras and Chester Watersheds have signed onto a <u>ShoreRivers Petition</u> voicing support for increased forest protection in the county. When signing onto the petition, the signator said:

...The proposed text amendments are aligned with the County's vision, and will help to strengthen protection for the natural features of our County while "embracing sufficient economic opportunities to provide for the economic well-being of [it's] citizens." (Kent Comp Plan, pg. 1).

Trees of all ages are a vital component for restoration efforts such as green stormwater management practices, stream bed restoration, achieving nutrient reductions in runoff, carbon sequestration, and shading impermeable surfaces. Based on these benefits and more, these community members support the proposed text amendments as a positive and realistic strategy to improve forest conservation in Kent County, and urge the Commissioners and the Planning Department to adopt a favorable report.

Based on the numerous benefits that trees have in our watershed and the hundreds of supporters of our petition, ShoreRivers supports the proposed text amendments, and urges the Task Force to adopt a favorable stance.
